#### SHARING THE FAITH ON SHARING THE FAITH

In her book named "Jerusalem, One City Three Faiths," Karen Armstrong speaks about the intellectual movement that began in Europe in the mid 1800's to the early 1900's, which had as its purpose to explain the bible from a scientific, historical-archeological basis. The arrival of Biblical Archeology had begun a quest for intellectual certainty.

As scientists and historians began gathering in Israel with the good intentions of explaining the legitimacy of the bible and proving its truths, the new scientists ran into some challenges when the stories in the bible didn't always match what their discoveries were revealing to them. For instance, one of the many things that was discovered and confirmed, and is still affirmed today, was the work by the American archeologist, Frederick Bliss, who proved that native peoples, Bedouin and Arabic peoples, inhabited the area around Jerusalem centuries before King David arrived around 1000b.c. Bliss's archeological work, which has stood the test of time, proved that the earliest settlements were not on Mount Zion but on the other side of the city on the Ophel. This discovery has significance yet today, as the dispute between current day Palestinians and Jews about who has primacy over the land is a formidable source of tension and violence in the area.

But more than the detailed discoveries that the past and current science continues to uncover in the Holy Land, Armstrong makes the much more important spiritual point that "Modernity was gradually changing religion. People in Europe and the United States had lost the art of thinking in symbols and images."

When I led groups through the Holy Land for 20, years, one of my biggest concerns in explaining our experience there is that though the facts and the science are interesting, they are not central to the importance of our visit to the Holy Land – they are secondary. What is centrally important as we walk along the Sea of Galilee, or pray at Gethsemane, sing hymns on Mt. Tabor and kneel at the place where Christ was said to be crucified, is that we do not lose the art of thinking spiritually, with all the symbols and images that help strengthen our Christian faith. Our shared faith is that which keeps us cosmically connected through Christ and to each other.


# Men's Noon Lunch & Fellowship
