SHARING THE FAITH

"April showers bring May flowers," so says the old saying. Seems pretty straightforward, but I think there's more to it than that. I think the statement speaks about the ups and the downs, the Yin and the Yang of life, or the fact that the dark of night is followed by the light of the new day dawning. I am disregarding the suggested order here, that dark days of showers are always first before the proverbial flowers of life spring up. We all know that the sequence, flowers and showers or showers and flowers, can and do occur in different order.

Along the same line of thought, I am brought back to a line from Gene Shepherd's hilarious tale that most of us watch around the holidays, "A Christmas Story," in which the story's author/narrator says, "Isn't that the way it is? At the very height of our revelry, we are struck down with the realities of life." You pick the phrase that you resonate with most, but that April showers do indeed bring May flowers or vice-versa is reality – just the way life is. But I don't believe that for the Christian it (life) means simply taking the good with the bad. Rather, I believe that if we truly explore the glories of our faith, we can take the good with the good and also the bad with the good.

Let me start with the easy part, taking the good with the good. You know about those times, when things are right in the world and with God. When our health and the health of loved ones is good, the kids are good, relationships, jobs, money, spirituality and faith are all working just fine. When the good is really good and the May flowers are "in bloom," we ought to...are called to...celebrate! When the life that God has given us is yielding bounteous amounts of grace and fields of flowers in bloom, we as Christians have a calling to share in the good news, especially to those who are no doing so well.

But what about those times when good things seem bad. I'll stretch here some and say that for the practicing, mature Christian this should never be the case. Our faith in Jesus Christ is the firm, fertile ground in which our flowers will bloom when our faith, in good times and bad, is as it should be. This, my dearly beloved, is the Easter message. There are no "bad times" or showers or Yang nor fear of eternal dark nights for those who believe in the resurrection. Christ's resurrection is ours to celebrate, to pray about, and to share with others. Easter and the hope that Easter brings can have the bloom of May flowers even in the shadow of death, because in His resurrection, Christ conquered death for us!

A short closing example of one of the scenarios that I have been witness to in the past. Just before Lent several years ago I received an e-mail from one of the members of the church that I served asking for prayers for a young man who was seriously ill. Several days later, and after praying for the young man's recovery, I received another e-mail that informed me that the young man had died. We again engaged in prayer for his friends and family. Two days afterward, came the message that the family was celebrating that their son was now with the Lord, thanking us for prayers, and that the family, because they believed in "May flowers" rather than the showers, or because it was a time for eternal morning sunrise rather than the dark night, the family had decided to donate their son's vital organs to help save the lives of others. Out of the drenching showers comes new life – The Resurrection!

Taking the good with the good is one thing to celebrate for sure, but taking the bad as something good is the mark of a true believer in the resurrection.

Christ has died Christ is Risen Christ will come again!!!






Men's Noon Lunch & Fellowship

The church began with a direct special invitation to Dr. Wagid Fahim Guirgis during his attendance at the annual Boston Church Conference on July 5, 1997, to serve and to start an Arab evangelical church in Daytona Beach, where he has been practicing medicine since 1982. After returning from the conference, he contacted his friend Mr. Moufid Samuel Webbee who lived in the same city and they agreed to start the church, and therefore a few faithful friends were invited to establish the church.

The group started with the first meeting at Dr. Wagid's house two weeks later, a meeting in which four people attended. The small group decided to look for an American church in the area to start the church in its facility. The choice was on West Minster by the sea Presbyterian Church on the same street as Dr. Wagid lives.

They decided to contact the pastor of the church, Rev. Jeffrey Sumnner, where they met with him in the presence of his assistant, Rev. George Painter, in a restaurant in the same area. After being told how the call for church began, Pastor Sumner immediately agreed to grant the Arabic Church the use of their American church building for meetings there free of charge.

The church began its first official meeting in the American Church building on August 3, 1997. Pastor Wissam Khalaf served in this opening and the hymn was led by Dr. Wagid Fahim Guirgis. The group decided to name the church the Arabic Evangelical Church of Daytona Beach, as it preaches the gospel, and belongs in its creed, foundations, and constitution to the Evangelical Presbyterian Church in Egypt. The church was officially registered in Florida on November 17, 1997.

The Church Council, consisted of Pastor Wagid Guirgis, Mr. Moufid and Mrs. Suzan Guirgis, invited several ministers to serve and several evangelistic revivals were held, and the attendance in these meetings was more than expected by anyone, and the presence of the Holy Spirit in these meetings was wonderful and many souls were saved.

Weekly church services on Sundays, public Sunday service, the practice of the Lord's Supper, and Bible study provided by Pastor Dr. Wagid, as well as prayer and praise meetings in the middle of the week.

Arabic Church in Daytona Beach held a revival service on January 27 and 28, 2024. Among those present was Dr. Youssef Wassef, a physician who resides with his family in Gainesville, Florida. He told us that there is no Arabic speaking evangelical church in his city, which has many students and asked, if possible, to start an Arabic evangelical church there. We, the pastors of the church here at Daytona Beach, felt that this was a message from the Lord for us to begin a ministry there.
